Free Lace Scarves Workshop

Description

Have some extra ribbon and trim? Need an excuse to buy that one skein of fantastic yarn? We will cut up silk scarves and sew them back together using Mokuba Free Lace, thread, ribbon, yarn, and trims. Turn an everyday scarf into wearable art. We will practice the beautiful narrow hand-rolled hem and learn some fun ways to tie a scarf. Look in your attic and dresser drawers for old scarves, or try your local thrift stores for silk scarves at great values.

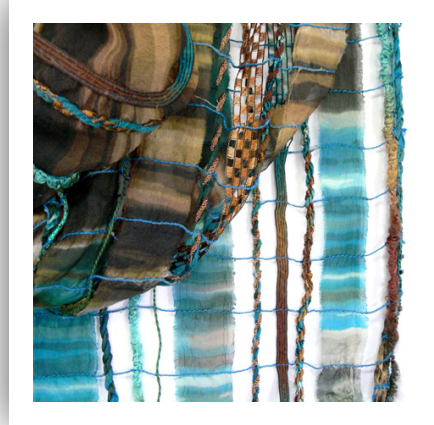
Workshop length: 5-6 hours

Supply List

- One scarf either square (app. 36") or oblong (app. 10" x 60"), or, if you prefer, a piece of scarf-weight fabric (knitted scarves are NOT suitable)
- A variety of ribbon, trim, and yarn that will work with the colors in your scarf; consider overall feel, look, and colors when choosing ribbon, trim, and yarn
- One piece Mokuba Free Lace stabilizer app. 20" x 80" or 10" x 53" (available for purchase for \$32 and \$15 on day of workshop)
- A variety of threads (i.e. regular, metallic, variegated, perle cotton)
- Sewing machine (with walking foot, if available)
- Basic sewing supplies: straight pins, hand-sewing needles, shears, seam ripper, rotary cutter and mat, rulers, fabric marker
- Hand-sewing needles suitable to use with silk
- Small crochet hook (optional) for making yarn/thread chains
